

## Day 1 Private Transfer to Rome Hotel

This 2-hour walking tour is led by an expert archaeologist and a knowledgeable local guide, immersing you in one of the most well-preserved archaeological sites in the world. Discover Pompeii's notable landmarks, such as the Marina Gate, the Basilica, the Forum, ancient baths, and the Lupanar (brothel).

## Day 5 Orvieto - Florence

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### Orvieto

Tour the gorgeous medieval town of Orvieto overlooking the Umbrian countryside, perched on a rock cliff in Umbria, Italy. Also known as the Duomo and the Cathedral of Santa Maria Assunto, the Cathedral of Orvieto is stunning. It all began back on November 13, 1290 when Pope Nicholas IV laid the flagstone. The altarpiece-like facade is worth spending a few minutes admiring before heading inside. The facade is adorned with lively golden mosaics. Keep an eye out for the statue of the holy cow: a bovine with angel wings.

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### Private Walking Tour of Florence

The urban fabric of Florence has remained unchanged, and its marvelous historic center – a UNESCO World Heritage site since 1982 – is packed with cobblestone streets, sophisticated palaces, superb churches and world-class museums overflowing with masterpieces by the greatest Italian artists.

Surrounded by the iconic Tuscan rolling hills, dotted with vineyards and olive groves, Florence is also a paradise for foodies and wine fanatics.

### Accademia Museum

Visit Accademia Museum or rather, The Galleria dell'Accademia in the heart of Florence. It is without a doubt most famous for its sculptures by the great Renaissance artist, Michelangelo. His Prisoners (or Slaves), his St. Matthew

and, above all, the magnificent statue of David are what first draw most of the hundreds of thousands of visitors the museum welcomes every year.

#### Day 7 Florence - Siena - San Gimignano

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##### San Gimignano

Visit the medieval town of San Gimignano, a small walled village about halfway between Florence and Siena, famous for its fascinating medieval architecture and towers that rise above of all the other buildings offering an impressive view of the city from the surrounding valley.

Recognized as a UNESCO World Heritage Site since 1990, San Gimignano offers visitors the chance to step back in time while enjoying its famed local products including saffron and its white wine, the Vernaccia di San Gimignano.

##### Siena

Travel to the beautiful walled city of Siena, famous for its cuisine, art, museums, medieval cityscape and the Palio, a horse race held twice a year in Piazza del Campo.

#### Day 8 Florence - Venice

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##### Travel from Florence to Venice

Journey from Florence to Venice with possible stops to the city of Bologna, known for its amazing culinary scene and authentic Italian culture or Padova to admire the Basilica of St. Antony.
